Don't Leave Home Without It

- Identification**
- Driver's license
- Cash
- Credit card
- Phone calling card
- Health insurance information**
- Water bottles/containers**
- Personal Cooler for Lunches**

First Things First

- Dry Bag
- Spare paddle
- Life jacket – Appropriately sized**
- Seat pads and/or back supports
- Duct tape
- Bilge Sponge or Bailer
- Rope or bungee cords to secure day packs
- Car keys
- Rope or nylon webbing with carabineer on each end for bow line on canoe

Shelter From The Storm

- Tent
 - Rain fly
 - Stakes
 - Poles
 - Ground cloth
- Sleeping bags
- Air/Ground Mattress
- Camp chairs or butt pads
- Camp pillows

Come And Get It!

- Reusable Dinnerware**
 - Silverware
 - Plate
 - Cup
 - Bowl
- Heavy-duty plastic bag or container for ice storage in cooler
- Biodegradable soap
- Waterless Hand Sanitizer
- Dish towel
- Extra zip lock bags

- Flashlight or headlamp
- Fresh batteries, spares, and spare bulbs
- Paperback book
- Journal, notebook, or sketch pad
- Pencils and pens

Dress For Success

TIP: Pack fresh clothes in Zip-lock bags and put a fabric softener sheet in each bag.

- Extra Socks
- Extra set of warm, dry clothes**
- Bandanas

- Windproof Lighter
- Whistle
- Compass
- Waterproof matches
- Fire Starter or Candle
- Multi-tool with knife
- First Aid Kit
- Duct Tape

Tools of The Trade

These tools have proven useful on river cleanups. The items are merely suggestions – nothing is required. If you bring your own tools, you may wish to distinctively mark them.

- Long handled net or “Litter Tongs”
- 5-10 gallon bucket with handle
- Rope, Cam Straps and/or Bungees
- Garden Trowel (for getting mud out of tires)
- Multi-tool
- Pocket Knife
- Collapsible/Foldable Shovel or Spade
- Bow Saw & spare blade(s)
- Tow Strap with hooks
- Come Along
- Bolt Cutter
- Pick Axe
- Sledge Hammer
- Tin Snips
- Fence Pliers
- Crescent Wrench
